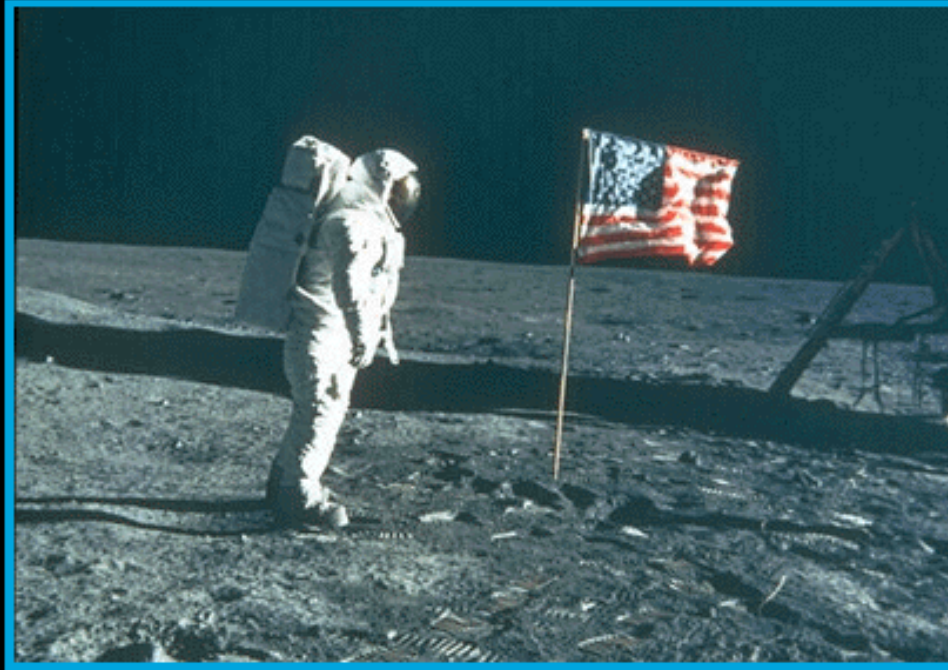


What is a Leader?

ACE Model

A

- Appropriateness – use opinions or actions of others to encourage someone to do the same

C

- Consistency – show how behavior is consistent with his likes/dislikes

E

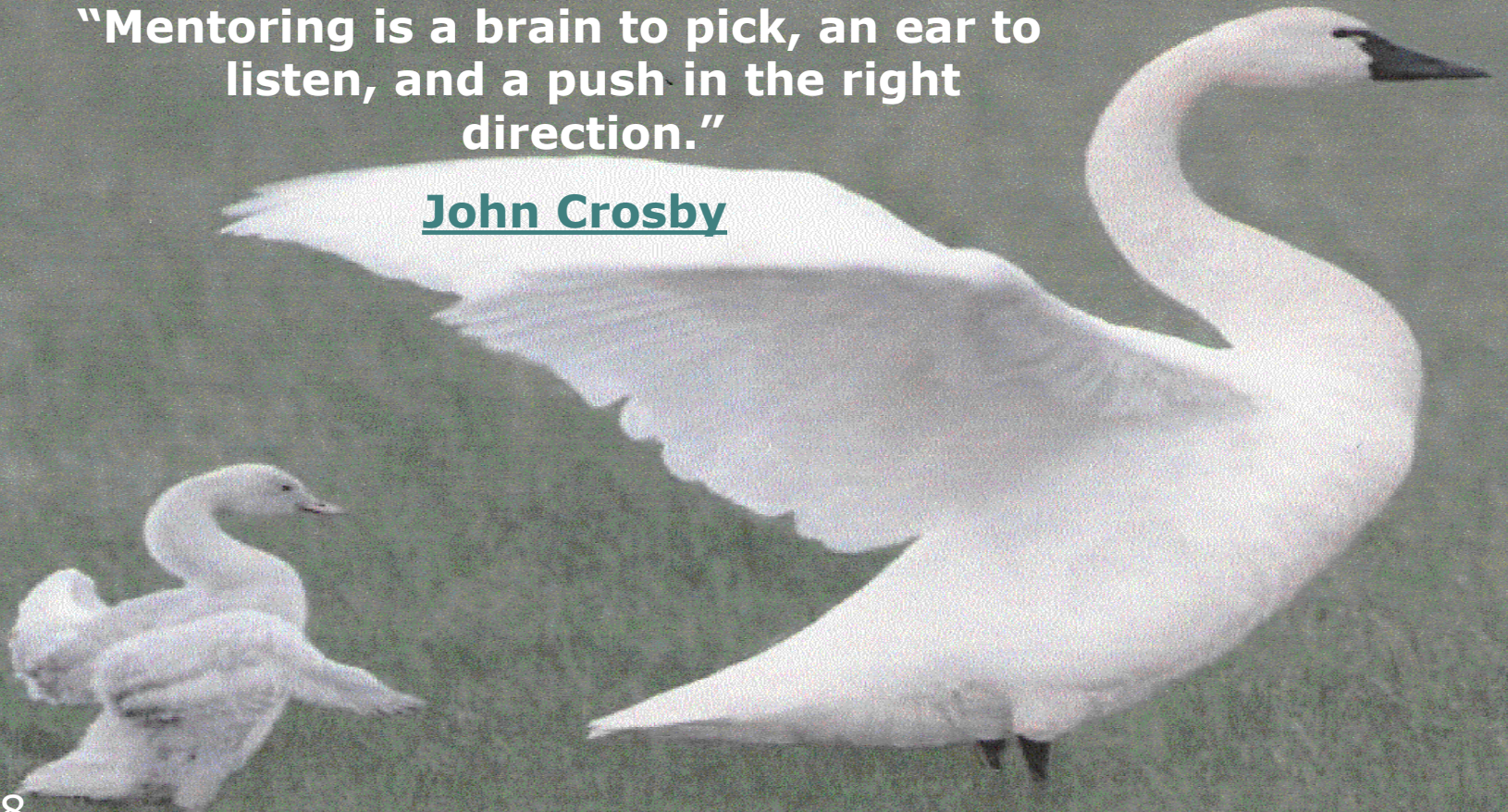
- Effectiveness – show how behavior will bring about a mutually desired outcome?


